Forgiving is Hard

Luke 17:3–5

- Not “natural”
- Always counter-cultural
- Scale proposed – Bearing with → Forgiving
- The deeper the hurt, the harder to forgive
- Forgiving can feel “wrong” – feels like letting evil win
- This is a topic that can stir buried pain

Forgiving is Therapeutic

- Resentment is Soul Poison
- Forgiving important for freedom
- Forgiving important for peace
- This characteristic of forgiveness not emphasized in Bible

Colossians 3:12–14

Community ...

- Forgiveness needed for Community to thrive
- Community needed when Forgiveness is hard

Ephesians 4:31–5:2

- The Logic of Forgiving
- This emphasized most in Bible
- Why Forgive? Because God has forgiven us
- We become like the one we worship

What is hardest about forgiving others for you?

Have you had any experiences where forgiving others proved significant? How?

How could we help each other to forgive?
